Project Info & Update

Youth Engagement

Since February, Hunters View HOPE SF Youth Leaders have been learning about the Hunters View revitalization project and the process of planning, including community mapping and surveying. Through visits with the development team and project architects, they have also learned about career paths into architecture, planning, and development.

As a part of the process, they have identified additional features for the new Phase IA park. In June, these Youth Leaders will attend a two-day conference at UC Berkeley and present their work to colleagues, HOPE SF development teams, and

Other Youth Programs

The UC Berkeley Center for Cities & Schools (CCS) and SF NOMA (National Organization of Minority Architects) have been working with 3rd and 4th graders at Malcolm X Academy on a series of hands-on architecture and planning projects to express their visions for the community. Youth from Ms. Moore

and Ms. Rahima's classes focused on neighborhood and school revitalization projects in Hunters View, and identified how the special needs of children and neighbors of all ages and abilities might be incorporated into the design of public spaces. They will present their findings at the end of May to their peers, teachers, mentors, CCS, and the development team.

Construction Update

Phase IA Schedule and Funding Update

While the Hunters View team has secured the funds necessary to construct Phase IA infrastructure, access to the \$30 million in state funding has been delayed by California's on-going budget crisis. The team is currently working to access this critical funding so that the project can proceed as quickly as possible, however this process is anticipated to take a minimum of several months. It is currently anticipated that Phase I site work will commence in July or August. The best way to stay updated on the schedule is to attend the

Demolition of buildings is now complete and the site has been cleared. Until the start of infrastructure, the site will remain inactive and

patrolled by security 24-hours a day.

Dust Control

There is no longer dust monitoring on site because there is no activity in the Phase I area. Your safety is important to us. Any exposed dirt on the construction site has been covered with a crust material that will prevent dust from being generated.
